

# Northern landfill

#### \*Regulations of use

One of the major challenges for municipalities is to responsibly manage the residual materials produced on their territory. Indeed, disposal has long been the only way to dispose of waste. Today, the concept of waste management goes far beyond landfill and incineration.

That's why the Municipalité de la Côte-Nord du Golfe du St-Laurent is working to implement recycling programs in each of our communities. Chevery and Harrington already have a system that works very well. Recycling makes it possible, among other things, to minimize the costs associated with cleaning up sites, extend the life of sites and to avoid pollution by burning recyclable materials such as plastic. In this sense, the Québec Residual Materials Management Policy proposes more environmentally friendly management while contributing to Québec's social and economic development.

The terms "residual materials" or "residues" used in the policy mean any residue from a production, transformation or use process, any substance, materials or product or more generally any movable property abandoned or intended for abandonment by the holder. The municipality or its representative can still incinerate these residual materials safely and with respect for the population.

However, the policy does not cover the following categories of tailings: gaseous materials and soils that contain contaminants in quantities. We are talking about so-called "dangerous goods" materials. Inside our depots, there is a specific place for each of these categories. Please take the time to locate the right place when you need to dispose of such materials.

The municipality is currently working on an action plan with the MRC to get scrap metal out of our municipal sites. Contractors will also be notified of the prohibition on disposing of any non-household waste in our open dumps. They can refer to the municipality at : info@mcngsl.org, for more information.

#### Ponant Group cruise in September 2024

The Ponant cruise line group, a French luxury and adventure company with approximately 125 people on board, approached the Municipalité de la Côte-Nord du Golfe du St-Laurent via the Port of Hâvre-St-Pierre to welcome a cruise ship in September 2024.

The cruise line's request was made for the Port of Harrington Harbour and the Port of La Romaine. Following a meeting between the partners in the field, it was decided to propose a stopover on Providence Island and to offer adventure tourists to cross to Chevery.

Stopover will be approximately 6 hours and a proposal for each port has already been sent to the Ponant Group.

An AD HOC table has been created to prepare our stakeholders to properly receive cruise passengers. The duration of the stopovers being quite short, a precise schedule will have to be established.

The involvement of citizens will be crucial to ensure that we offer a maximum experience to passing tourists and perhaps create a precedent.

We will keep you updated of future developments.

This is a great opportunity for our region and the economic spinoffs will be quite significant.

#### New municipal structure proposal

The Municipalité de la Côte-Nord du Golfe du St-Laurent is working with representatives of each village and the Executive Director of MAMH to propose modifications to our municipal structure.

We are waiting for the Minister's comments on this proposal for future discussion with the population. These changes would bring the municipal structure closer to a municipal council while retaining the administrator.

This proposal would be more representative of our situation and these discussions have been ongoing since 2018.

Meetings with the population will be planned in the coming months.

#### Land acquisition from the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forests

\*To lease or purchase public land as a first applicant, you must:

- 1. Fill out an application to use public land (PDF 204 Kb) (in French only).
- 2. Attach the documents specified in the "Additional Documents Required" section of the form, including :
  - a <u>notice of compliance with municipal by-laws (PDF 144 Kb)</u> (in French only).

3. Pay a non-refundable administration fee of \$137.97 (including GST and QST) when you submit your application:

- By cheque or money order made payable to the Minister of Finance of Québec.
- 4. Send your complete application, by mail or email, to the contact information below.

5. Once your application has been examined, you will receive a notice of acceptance or refusal. If your application is accepted, the notice will be accompanied by administrative and contractual documents (e.g. lease for signature).

6. The next step will then be for you to apply for a building permit from your municipality.
